James 1:16-18

INTRODUCTION:

- I. Guard Against Deception (v.16)**
- A. We are tempted to blame God for our sin
 - B. We are tempted, not only to sin, but to avoid taking responsibility for it
 - C. Satan is at large in and around the church to provoke her to unbelief

- II. Understand the nature of the Gift (v.17a)**
- A. EVERY good gift
 - 1. Most immediately, wisdom
 - a) Connecting faith to the trial
 - b) The context is a trial
 - 2. More broadly, Himself
 - a) This will come to light later
 - b) We must first reckon with the understanding that God is perfect, good, holy, and true and wants only such things for His children
 - B. Every GOOD gift
 - 1. Every gift is good and perfect
 - 2. The source of the gift is good and perfect

- 3. The result of the gift is good and perfect according to the Giver
 - a) God is perfectly good
 - b) God causes all things to be good for those who are His own (**Romans 8:28**)
 - c) So, for God's children, our understanding of "good" is tied to our understanding of being "called" by God
- C. Every good GIFT
 - 1. Free & undeserved
 - 2. The Gift is reflective of the Gift of salvation
 - a) This means every gift we receive is for the purpose of magnifying the gospel
 - b) Brings perspective to the gift of suffering
 - (1) **Isaiah 48:10**
 - (2) Richard Baxter, "*Suffering so unbolts the door of the heart, that the Word hath easier entrance.*"
 - (3) **2 Corinthians 1:5-7** will also share in our comfort."
 - 3. Every good & perfect gift is available for the asking
 - a) Wisdom (**v.5**)
 - b) Through trials -- trials then become a gift from God (not necessarily

- asked for) because of the gift of wisdom given through them
- c) Ask expectantly
- (1) Because you are in a trial
 - (2) Because the purpose of trials is to deepen & strengthen faith
 - (3) Because faith pleases God
(Hebrews 11:6)
 - (4) Because God's word commends and commands it
 - (5) Because we don't see as clearly as we ought the connection between the trial and faith
 - (6) Because the answer is waiting
(James 3:17)

This means that every gift of God is a gospel-kind of gift. God gives us (His children) Himself by giving us wisdom to see that each trial we face is to deepen our dependence upon, and worship of, Him...FAITH.

- A. The construction of this passage would have us believe that trusting the Giver of Gifts carries the greater weight
- B. Creator
1. Father
 2. Sovereign over the cosmos
 3. Designed as He sees fit
 4. Source of all that is
 - a) Unchangeable & Consistent
 - b) **Genesis 1:3-4**
 - c) **Isaiah 45:5-7**
- C. Re-Creator
1. Father of His own
